SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

WEB REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Students can now register on line.

Go to www.clunet.edu and under shortcuts click on Web Advisor.

1. Log in
2. Click on Web Advisor for Students
3. Click on Register for classes
4. If you know the synonym number (this is the schedule number) of the course click on Express Registration, if not click on Search and Register for Classes
5. Express Registration:
 - a. Enter synonym number
 - b. Enter subject (i.e. Bus)
 - c. Enter course number (i.e. 251)
 - d. Enter section number (i.e. 01)
 - e. Enter term (i.e 06/SP)
 - f. Enter Take For (i.e. credit, pass/no credit, audit, or waitlist)
 - g. Submit
 - h. View your schedule before logging out.**
 - i. After viewing your schedule, **Log Out**.
 - j. You have completed the registration process
6. Search and Register for classes
 - a. Enter Term (i.e. 06/SP)
 - b. Enter Subject (i.e. Bus)
 - c. You may submit at this time or enter more information
 - d. Click on the box next to the desired classes
 - e. Click on Submit
 - f. Click on Submit again if you are now finished with registration
 - g. View your schedule before logging out.**
 - h. After viewing your schedule, **Log Out**

Notes:

If the class indicates Wait in the box for the Take For field then the class is closed and you can place yourself on the waitlist. You will not be able to waitlist for a class that is offered at the same time of another course in which you are registered.

If you have a hold on your record a message will appear at the top of the screen indicating which office has placed the hold. You will not be able to register until all holds have been cleared.

Registration appointments for undergraduate students begin at 5:00pm. The schedule can be found on the Registrar's Office web page (www.clunet.edu/Registrar).

A confirmation that your registration has been accepted will be emailed to you at your CLUNET email address. If you do not receive an email verify your enrollment through WebAdvisor. If, at any time, proof is required of a successful change to your enrollment, a copy of the email confirmation will be required.

Spring 2006 Registration Instructions

Guidelines for Advance Registration

1. Pick up registration forms from your academic advisor.
2. Arrange to meet with your advisor. A printed copy of your advising transcript is available from the Registrar's office. Your advisor needs to sign your completed registration form.
3. Clear any holds placed on your Records by Student Financial Planning, Student Accounts, Registrar's Office or other departments.
4. If you plan to register for independent study or internships, fill out the necessary forms. Independent study forms are available at the Registrar's Office and Internship forms are available at the Student Center. All forms must be signed by the appropriate persons and approved by the Registrar's Office prior to registration. **Please have your forms signed and approved before your registration appointment or before adding the course later.**
5. Take your completed registration materials to the Registrar's Office at your scheduled appointment time, or use WebAdvisor.

Advance Registration Schedule

Continuing Students: November 11–November 22, 2005

Registration is by appointment only and may be completed in person or over the Web. Registration over the web begins at 5:00 pm and walk-in registration begins at 8:30 the following day. The Registration times will be posted on the Registrar's web page no later than April 15. If you cannot come at your appointed time, you may register at a later time. You will not be allowed to register before your assigned time.

Fifth Year Students : November 11-November 22, 2005

Register at the Registrar's Office between 4 and 5 p.m or use WebAdvisor.

Special Students November 11-November 22, 2005

Register at the Registrar's Office between 2-4 p.m.

Special students are those who do not plan to obtain a degree from CLU and who are approved for special status. Special students may not complete more than 12 semester credits at CLU.

New Students

New students will receive registration information in their Admitted Student binder. If you have any questions, contact the Registrar's Office (493-3105).

New transfer students who have not previously registered - New

students will receive registration information in their Admitted Student handbook. If you have any questions, contact the Registrar's Office (493-3105).

Continuing students that did not register during advance registration may register any day during regular Registrar Office hours.

Important Information!

Payment

Pre-registered students will be billed prior to the start of the semester. Refer to Cost and Payment Options brochure for payment methods. All payments must be received by the beginning of classes. Official registration is complete when fees have been paid.

Attendance

Course selections will be held through the second class meeting only. If you do not attend by the second class meeting, your space may be given to someone else. California Lutheran University reserves the right to cancel a course due to insufficient enrollments.

Change of Schedule

Students who have registered for a class must complete a "Change of Schedule" form at the Registrar's Office to drop the course from their schedule. If you use WebAdvisor, a confirmation that your registration has been accepted will be emailed to your CLUNET email address. If at any time, proof is required of a successful change to your enrollment, a copy of the email confirmation will be required. **You will not automatically be dropped for non-attendance. There will be a \$50.00 transaction fee charged for any Registrar approved change of schedule submitted after the deadline.**

Student Responsibility

The student is responsible for any changes in his/her registration and should make note of add/drop deadlines. Failure to officially withdraw from a class will result in a grade of "UW" (Unofficial Withdrawal) which is equivalent to a grade of 'F' in computing the grade point average. Official withdrawals after the start of classes are assessed a "W" grade. Change of program forms (drop/add forms) may be obtained at the Registrar's Office.

Reduction of Charges

CLU does not automatically drop students from a class if they register but do not attend.

Students who withdraw from the University remain financially responsible for a reduced portion of their tuition and board charges according to the following schedule:

Tuition

1. Withdrawal during first and second week of the semester - 20% charge.
2. Withdrawal during third and fourth week of semester - 60 % charge.
3. Withdrawal during fifth week - 80% charge.
4. Withdrawal after the fifth week – 100% charge.

NOTE: A variation of this reduction policy may occur if the student has Federal Financial Aid. Also, excess proceeds from loans are not available until after the third week of classes.

Board

Board refunds are made on a proportionate basis computed from the date the student leaves campus.

Room

No refund is made for room once classes have started.

Fees

Other fees are not subject to refund.

PLEASE NOTE: All financial obligations must be met before academic records can be released. Registration for an upcoming semester will not be accepted until financial obligations are met for the previous semester.

Seniors

If you plan to graduate in December 2005, May 2006 or August 2006, you must submit an Application for Degree card and a Major Checklist to the Registrar's Office by the posted deadline dates. The graduation fee is \$50 until the priority deadline and \$75 after the priority deadline

Foreign Language Proficiency Information:

All CLU students are required, for CORE 21, to meet the Foreign Language Proficiency in one of the following ways:

- By achieving a high enough score on a Language Proficiency Exam
- By passing two courses in the same language
- By passing one course at the second semester level

Math Placement

All CLU students are required, for CORE 21, to meet the Mathematical Reasoning Proficiency by passing Math 111, 115 or 126.

The appropriate SAT score determines placement into CLU math courses. (See pre-requisites for each individual math course offered in the schedule of classes)

Global Perspectives

The Global Perspectives courses are listed in the Core 21 section under Global Perspectives. The Global Perspectives requirement is in effect for students who enter CLU Fall '04 or after with fewer than 28 credits. Students who entered CLU prior to Fall 2003 who have met the Global Studies requirement are exempt from the Global Perspectives requirement.

Humanities Tutorial

The Humanities Tutorial is a one-year team-taught interdisciplinary program for which students receive eight credits. This program is offered to qualified freshman or sophomore students regardless of major. Initial screening is made by the Admission office, with final acceptance being made by the instructors. See the course offering section of this schedule for Humanities Tutorial courses offered Spring 2005.

Schedule Changes

Schedule changes may be made through noon January 17 at the Registrar's Office. After January 17, all schedule changes will take place during normal add/drop period. A wait-list procedure is available for sections that are closed. A student placed on the wait-list may be notified prior to final registration if space has become available in a class. It is the student's responsibility to add the class, even if space becomes available in a class.

A confirmation of your registration over WebAdvisor will be emailed to your CLUNET email address. If, at any time, proof is required of a successful change to your enrollment, a copy of the email confirmation will be required.

English 111 Course Descriptions for Spring 2006

English 111: Critical Reading and Writing Spring 2006

As with all freshman English classes at CLU, course methodology emphasizes the development of critical reading, thinking, and writing. These course descriptions will also be posted on the Registrar's office web page (www.clunet.edu/Registrar). Please check there for additional descriptions.

- Cefola **WE, THE IMMIGRANTS:** Immigrants made America what it is today. This section of English 111 examines the lives of early and new immigrants as portrayed in their true stories, in which we seek to discover the threads that unite all of us who are immigrants and descendants of immigrants.
- Stevenson: **WEIRD STUFF--THE REPRESENTATION OF DEVIANCE IN LITERATURE (AND FILM):** This section of English 111 will use novels and film (mostly novels) to explore the ways in which representations of deviance (social deviance, sexual deviance, psychological deviance, and pathological deviance) possibly reveal and veil latent cultural anxieties.
- Schwarz: **THE OUTSIDER WITHIN--SEARCHING FOR IDENTITY AND MEANING THROUGH LITERATURE:** This section of English 111 encourages students to a greater self-awareness by developing an increased understanding of human nature from multiple perspectives in literature. The course readings explore the human condition in a global context with a respect for diversity and with a particular appreciation for the individual human journey toward meaning and identity.
